IdAM Portfolio

The DoD IdAM Portfolio provides digital identity, authentication, and authorization services for the DoD Enterprise. These services provide Components with tools to manage users and safeguard information technology (IT) resources.

Background

The primary goal of the DoD's Enterprise User initiative is to allow users to, "go anywhere in the DoD, login, and be productive". DoD Visitor is a key enabling component of this initiative. USCYBERCOM Communications Tasking Order (CTO) 10-116 mandates use of DoD Visitor on the NIPRNet, while CTO J3-13-0628 mandates its use on the SIPRNet.

Why DoD Visitor?

DoD Visitor provides immediate access to the NIPRNet/SIPRNet for any visiting user that presents a valid Common Access Card (CAC)/SIPRNet Hard Token/Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) certificate to a workstation by provisioning them with a temporary account. This account has limited privileges intended to provide the user with browser access to the NIPRNet/SIPRNet.

Visitor Provides Access to:

- The internet through Microsoft Internet Explorer (IE)
- Basic Microsoft Office applications (Word, PowerPoint, and Excel) and Adobe Acrobat Reader (if available on the local workstation)
- Currently installed local printers (from within the above applications)
- Temporary storage on the desktop and in the "My Documents" folder
- Specific applications fully configurable by the local Component

Implementing DoD Visitor

1. Download the application software and other related files from SoftwareForge. Users must create and maintain an active account. Contact the Forge [Support Desk](#) for instructions.
2. Install the ProV application software and Active Directory (AD) Group Policy Object (GPO) on any Windows Domain Controller supporting end-user device login.
3. Configure the AD GPO for accessible applications on client machines.
